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Equitable Services Non Public Schools

<u>Title I: Improving Academic Achievement of the Educationally Disadvantaged</u>

Federal dollars may be available to provide Title I services to eligible non-public school students through contract with Riverside School District. Eligibility is determined by the student't school and district of residence.

Services include:

- Title I remediation
- Classroom teacher consultation
- Parent Involvement

Process:

- Riverside School District engages in consultation with the non-public schools
- Non-public schools identify economically disadvantaged students
- Riverside School District submits a grant application setting aside dollars for identified nonpublic students
- Riverside School District contracts with 3rd party to provide services or utilizes district teachers/non-public teachers to provide instruction.
- The non-public school assists in identifying educationally disadvantaged students
- The teachers or 3rd party vendor provides services to the identified student(s)
- Riverside School District, non-public school administrators, and the 3rd party vendors engage in ongoing meaningful consultation.
- The Teachers/3rd party vendor and non-public schools participate in progress monitoring.
- Reports and data measuring student academic growth are required and shared with the non-public school and district to demonstrate program effectiveness.

Title II Part A: Improving Teacher Quality/Professional Development

Federal Title IIA funds are allocated to participating non-public schools to provide staff development in core academic subjects in order to increase student achievement. Staff development can include on or off site workshops, conferences, or courses. Professional development must be in addition to what the school is required to provide for staff. Cost of professional development is paid or reimbursed directly to the provider or individual teacher.

Process:

- Non-public schools complete the PNPE survey to participate in Title IIA
- Non-public schools may receive allocations based on student enrollment
- Administrators complete pre-approval form for professional development
- Riverside School District determines appropriateness of content and availability of funds

Title III: Language Instruction for Limited English Proficient and Migrant Students

Title III supplemental services provide professional development, equipment, after school programs, summer programs, and supplies for eligible students. Eligibility is based on screening and assessment by the Riverside School District. Funding can be used for various materials, supplies, resources, and professional development for teachers under Title III guidelines. The Riverside School District participates in the NEIU 19 consortium.

Title IV, Part A: Student Support and Academic Enrichment

Title IV, Part A, Student Support and Academic Enrichment Program (SSAEP) is a new formula block grant established as part of Every Student Succeeds Act. SSAEP funding must supplement local, state, & other Federal Funds. The three focus areas of the grant area are as follows: well-rounded education, student health and safety, and support effective use of technology.

- Riverside School District engages in consultation with the non-public schools
- Non-public schools complete the PNPE survey to participate in Title IVA
- Non-public schools may receive allocations based on student enrollment
- Administrators complete pre-approval form for professional development
- Riverside School District determines appropriateness of content and availability of funds
- Currently, Riverside School District utilizes Title IV funds to supplement Title II Programming at Riverside Elementary West School.
