 Please note that parent conferences will be held from 12:40-3:40 on February 8 and 9.  
 Students will be dismissed at **11:30 A.M.** on both dates.

NURSE'S NOTES



**Parents of Kindergarten, who have requested to have their child's physical exam done privately, must have the forms completed by their physician and turned into the nurse's office no later than May 8, 2017. Your child will be excluded from school on that date if they have not turned in the form. If you have any questions please contact Mrs. Jensen. -**

In accordance with Pennsylvania State Law, please be advised that medication will not be able to be dispensed to students without a written prescription from your child's doctor. This pertains to all medication, including Tylenol and cough medicine.  
 When receiving prescription medication from your doctor, please have him/her give you written instructions with your child's name, name of the medication, dosage to be given, and time it is to be given in school. These instructions must be brought to school with the medication **in the original bottle dispensed by the pharmacy**, along with written permission from the parent.  
**A parent must bring in the medication.** Many pharmacies will give an extra bottle for you to send into school. Written permission from a parent without a doctor's instructions is not acceptable. This includes Tylenol, Tums, cough or cold medicine, antibiotics or any type of ointments. Please do not send in medication with your child and assume it will be given without a doctor's written approval.  
**Medication must be brought into the school by a parent or an adult.** To assure the safety of all our students **DO NOT** send in any types of medication with your child.
