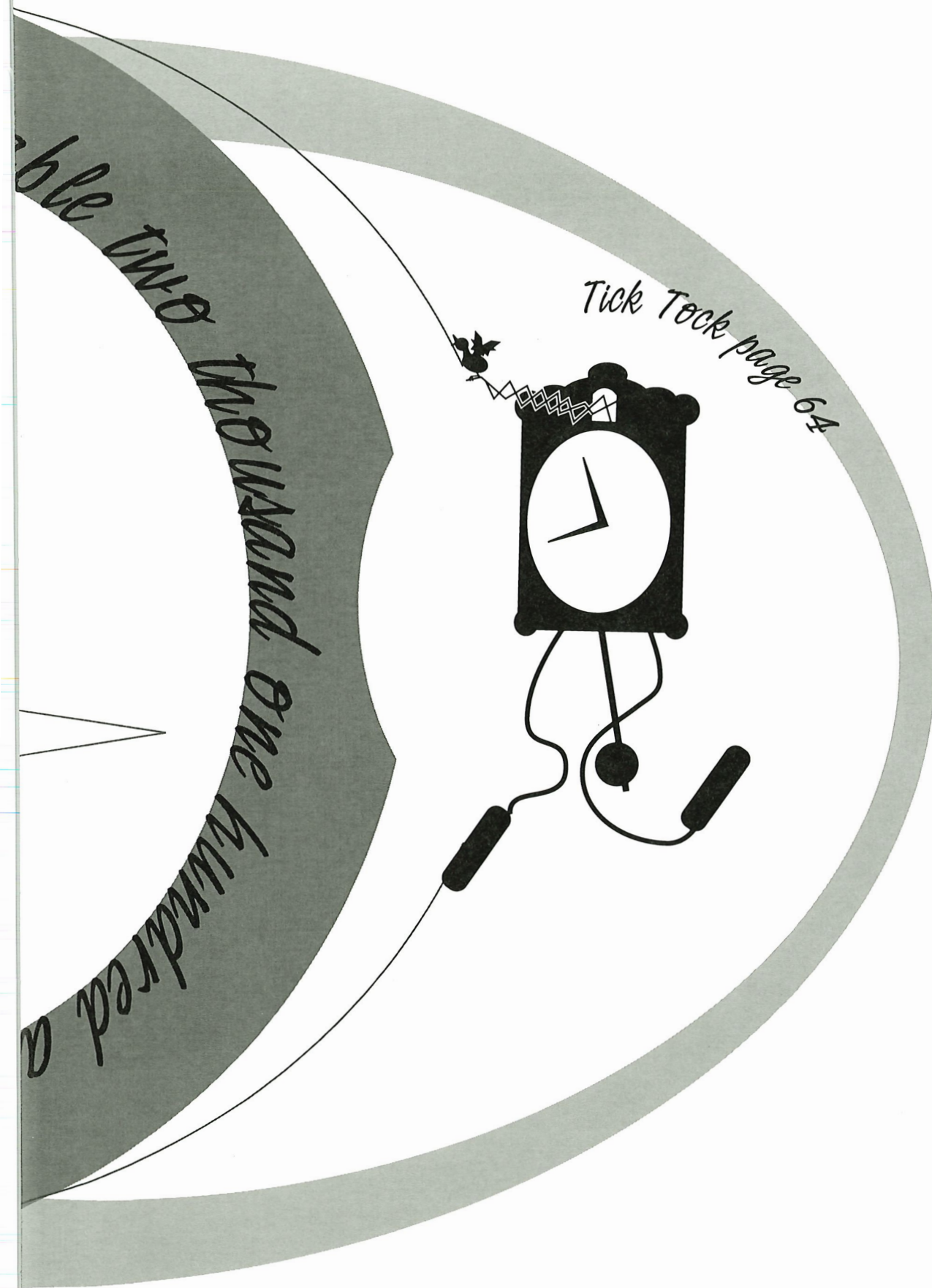

With a past that belonged to others.

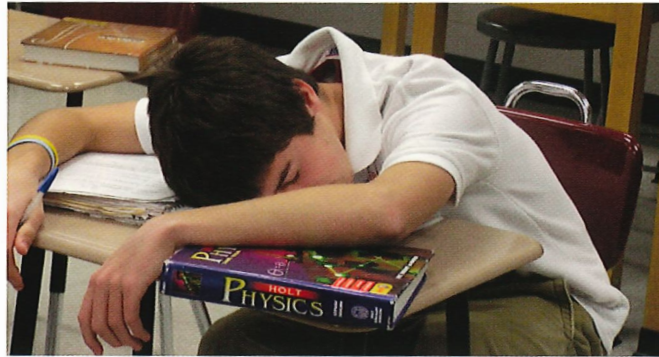

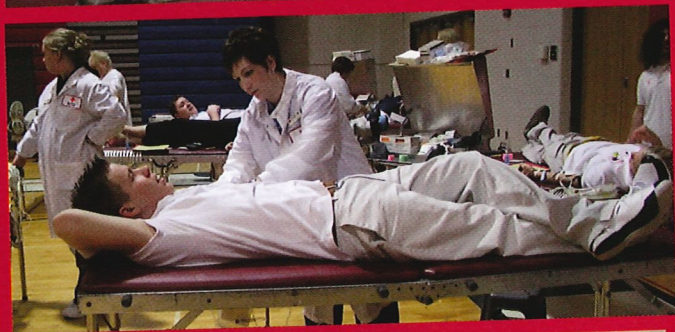
# Blood Drive

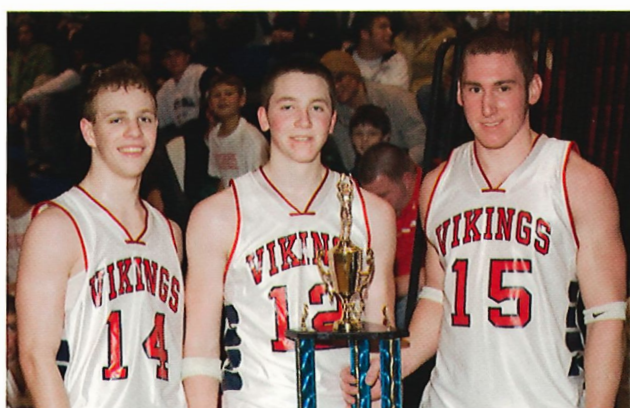

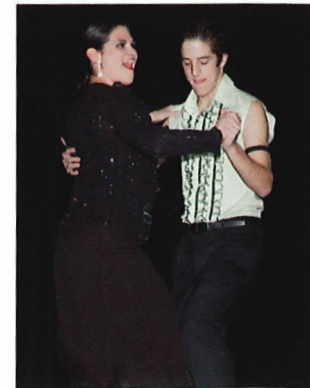
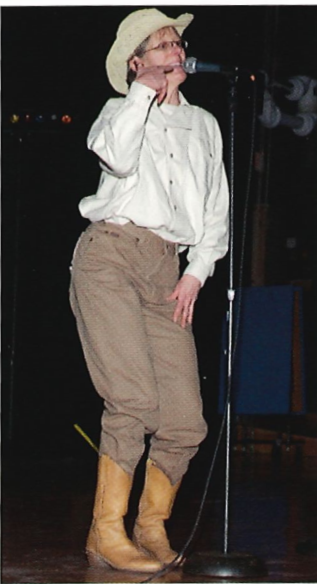








# *Twice the Memories...*

# HIGH SCHOOL MUSICAL

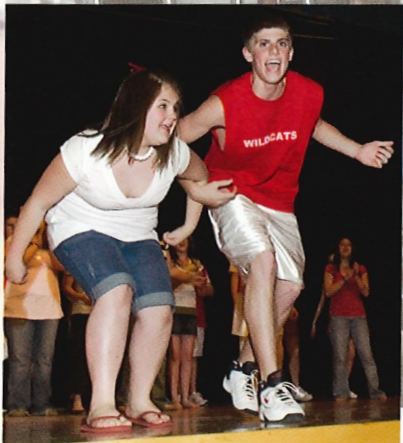
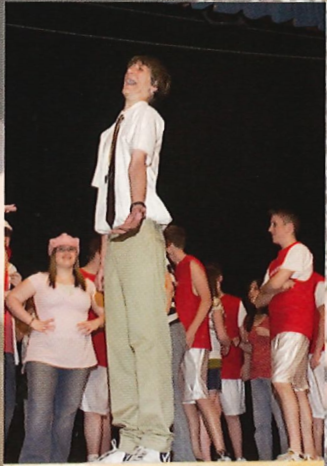
