The holiday season is soon approaching and we will show our spirit with some hall decorating, dress crazy days and homecoming.

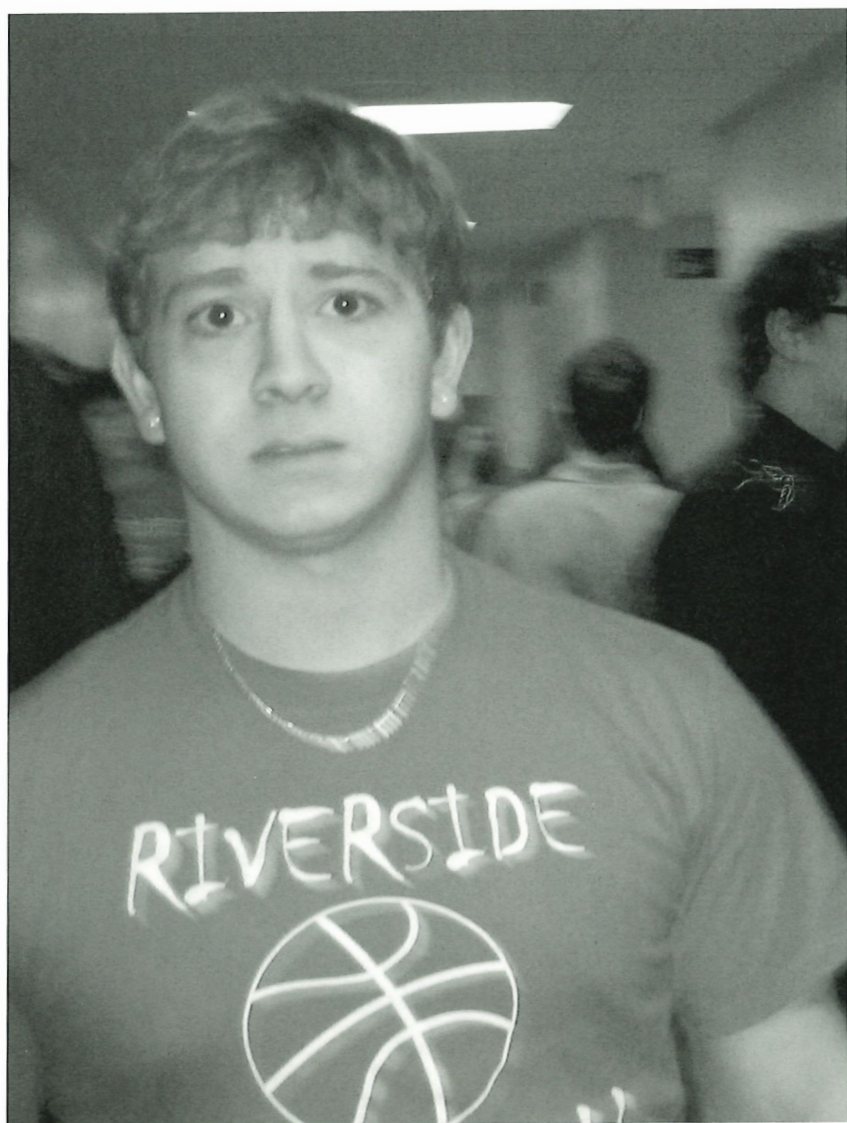
With all the hustle and bustle we sometimes need to relax. Teachers and seniors use the Thanksgiving flag football game as a nice way to get us started on our holiday break.

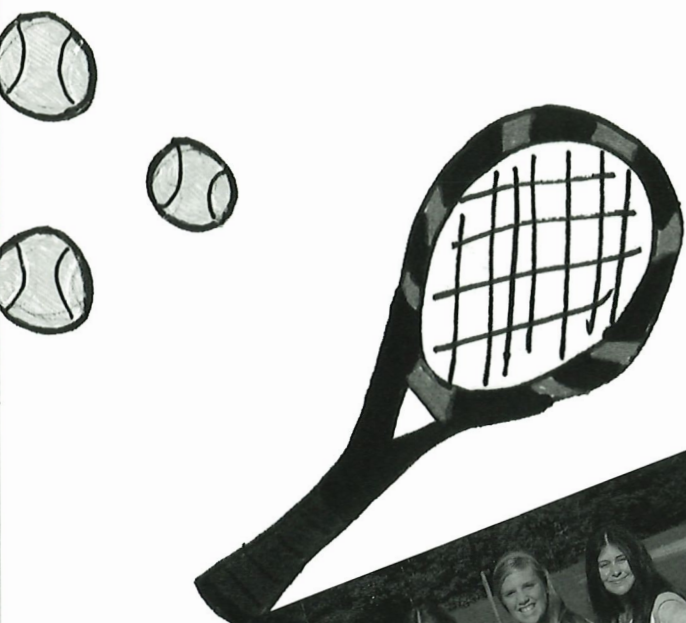




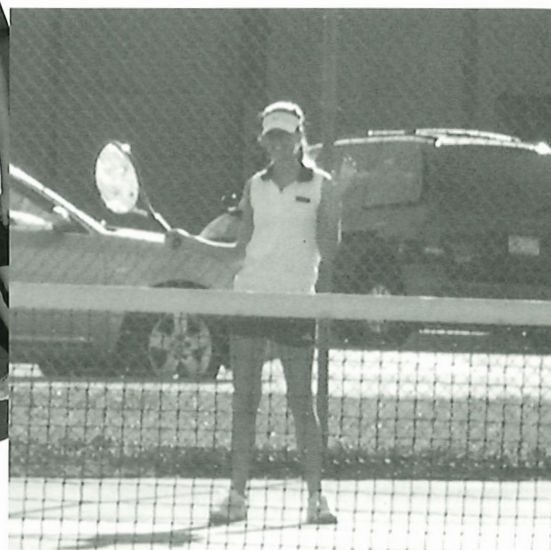
A Season of Fun

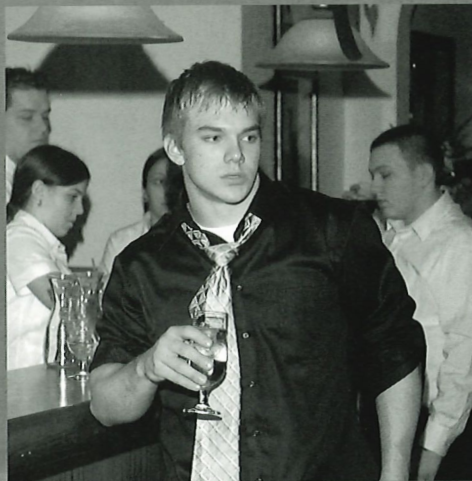




Semi Formal

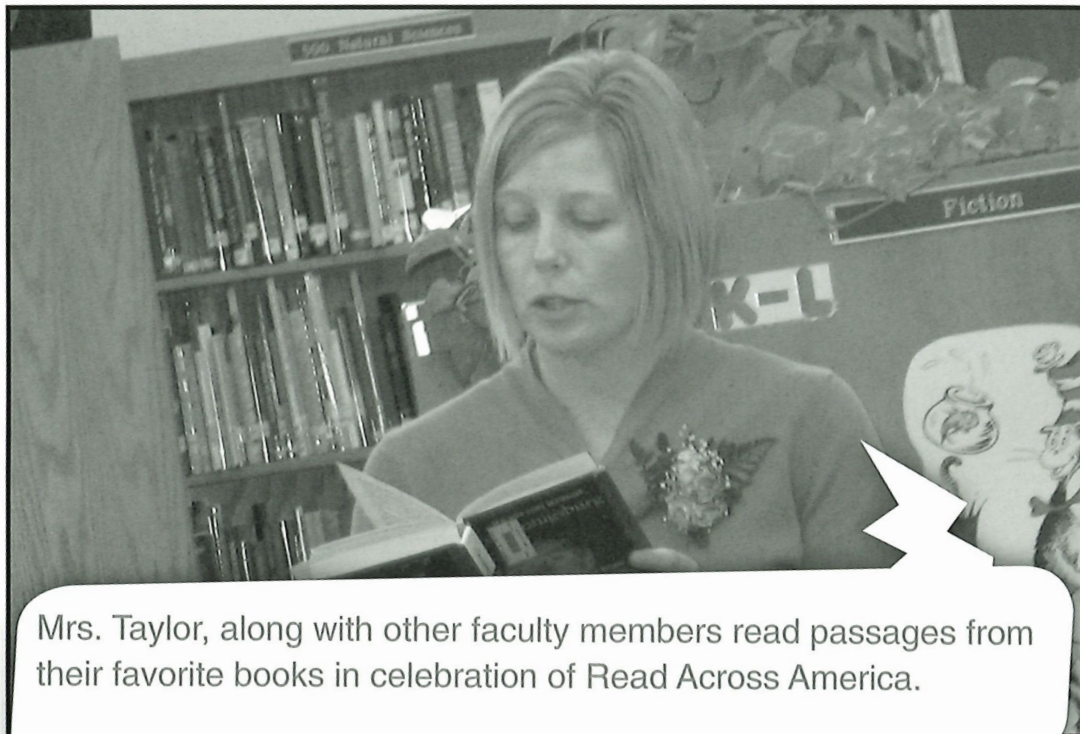
Inductions

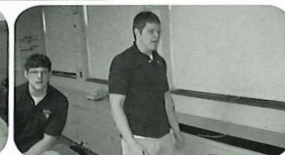


Colophon

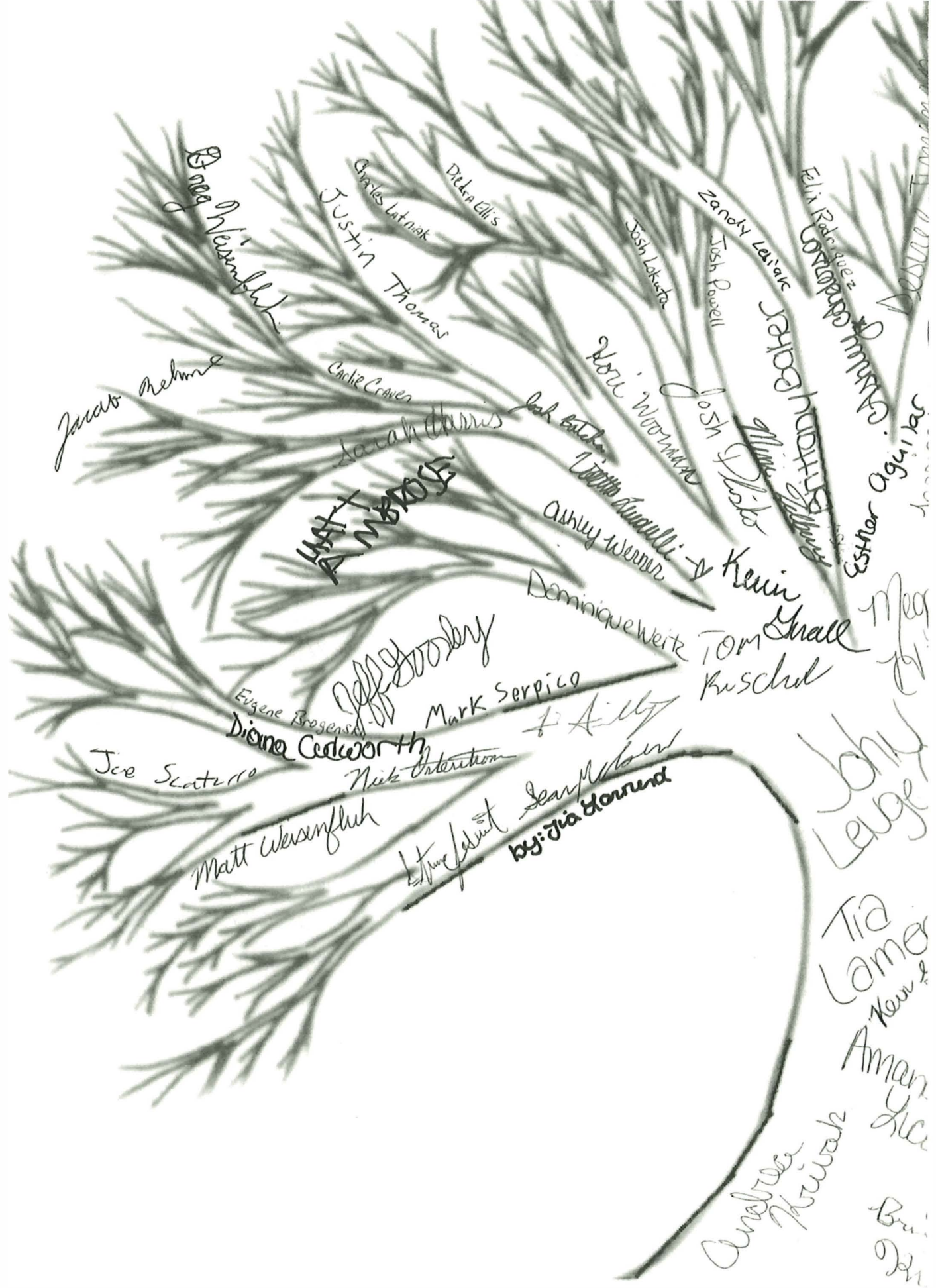


Remembering 2008
